#### **Priorities And Listening**

The New Year is always a great time to reassess our priorities. It is so easy to get off track and distracted by the multitude of activities, obligations and self-imposed restrictions. So, we have to take those times to stop and RESET. That has been the discussion in the latest sermon series. For us as Christians our RESET has to begin with Jesus. I sometimes think we fool ourselves that Jesus is a priority. If asked, we would all agree that we believe in Jesus and that He is Lord and Savior. Yet when we assess where our time and our resources are spent I think we will recognize that Jesus is not our first priority.

That not only goes for our own lives and our families lives but also it is a time for us as a church to reassess our priorities as well for ministry. I would encourage us to think about Ministry and Mission. What are we doing through the church? It isn't an easy question I know. But we have to ask in order to go forward with a new RESET.

I believe our most important ministries include focus on Children, Youth and Missions. Missions include our Ministry Area, Blanchard. There is a story, as an example, attributed to Bill Parcells, the famous NFL football coach. He seems to have told a story about two salesmen who were sent to Australia to sell shoes to the Aborigines. After arriving, one called back to his boss and said, "There are no opportunities here; the natives don't wear shoes." But the other called back and said to his boss, "There are a lot of opportunities here. These people don't have any shoes!"

We can read the alarming statistics as a sign that North Americans "don't wear shoes" or that North Americans "don't have shoes." Leonard Sweet declared, "Christianity is now such a nonfactor in the wider culture that people are becoming open to it as if for the first time.

I believe that for Blanchard First United Methodist to remain vital and an influence in the community we just need to find the needs and meet those needs. Just like supplying shoes to those who don't have shoes.

For Lent we are beginning a Lenten Sermon Series titled "LISTEN". Let us take a great opportunity for prayer and listening to the Holy Spirit lead us toward the needs of our community.

Balancing Truth and Grace
"For the Law was given through
Moses; grace and truth were
realized through Jesus Christ."
(John 1:17, NASB)

One of our adult small groups is doing the study The Trouble with the Truth: Balancing Truth & Grace. In it, we are coming to grips with the fact that keeping truth and grace in the perfect balance is tough. In fact, only ONE did it perfectly, Jesus Christ. But that is not an out for us; we are each called to struggle with this tension as we grow in the faith.

How does one go about this? We live in a church culture today that tends, for the most part, to do a pretty good job of focusing on Grace (love, mercy, etc.). And that is a good thing. But we probably don't focus on the truth of Scripture with the same energy. Many reasons...we don't want to offend others, the culture has overtaken us, the post-modern world screams that every "truth" is valid. It can be confusing.

We may ask that age-old question asked of Jesus by Pilate, "What is Truth?" (John 18: 38) How do we find the truth? We find God's truth by studying His word; both individually and corporately. God wants us to learn together in community. Community keeps one from straying individually from the intent of God's Word. Through small groups and corporate worship we help each other find the truth by studying the life of the ONE who embodied grace & truth perfectly.

What is Lent?

Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. Lent comes from the Anglo Saxon word lencten, which means "spring." The forty days represents the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, enduring the temptation of Satan and preparing to begin his ministry.

Lent is a time of repentance, fasting and preparation for the coming of Easter. It is a time of self-examination and reflection. In the early church, Lent was a time to prepare new converts for baptism. Today, Christians focus on their relationship with God, often choosing to give up something or to volunteer and give of themselves for others.

Sundays in Lent are not counted in the forty days because each Sunday represents a "mini-Easter" and the reverent spirit of Lent is tempered with joyful anticipation of the Resurrection.
